

Koya v. Koya, 2014-CV- 2055-DV	11- 30- 2015	The master was appointed to address Defendant-Husband's alimony claim. Given that Husband failed to file an Income and Expense Statement and did not appear at the hearing, the master determined that there was insufficient evidence to conclude that alimony was warranted in this case. Norman v. Norman, 2012-CV- 1174-DC	12- 15- 2015	The parties appeared before the master for a Settlement Conference. By the conclusion of the Settlement Conference, the parties had reached an overall agreement, the terms of which were summarized by the master's settlement conference memorandum. The parties intended to enter into a written agreement incorporating the terms of the agreement reached at the Settlement Conference. The parties were unable to enter into a written agreement and Husband filed to enforce the alleged agreement reached at the Settlement Conference. Wife responded to Husband's filing by alleging that there never was a final agreement. The Court referred the matter to the master. The master determined that the parties had entered into an enforceable agreement for the reasons set forth in the report and recommendation.	Cindy S. Conley
