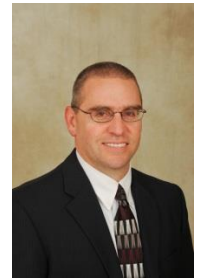

Mediator Experience:

I serve as a pro bono Mediator on the Mediation Panel of the United States District Court Middle District of Pennsylvania and mediate approximately two (2) cases per year. Additionally, I mediate private disputes, an additional two (2) or three (3) per year. I am an Adjunct Professor at the Weidner University School of Law Commonwealth Campus teaching an ADR course that includes instruction on Mediation.
