Mediator Experience: As an advocate, I have participated in mediations over the last 29 years in cases involving family law, personal injury, and construction disputes on behalf of homeowners, contractors, architects, and engineers. I have represented numerous professionals, including engineers and architects, in AAA mediations. As a Dauphin County Divorce Master from 2006 to 2013, I held a mediation conference in every case that was about to proceed to a hearing. The total number of cases exceeded 110.
