MEMORY OF JAMES D. CAMPBELL, JR.**

**WHEREAS**, James D. Campbell, Jr., passed away on August 22, 2025, in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania;

**WHEREAS**, the members of the Dauphin County Bar Association join Jim’s family and friends in commemorating his life, one lived with decency, love for family and devotion to community;

**WHEREAS**, Jim was born on September 15, 1941, in Allentown, Pennsylvania, the son of the late J. Duncan Campbell, Sr., and Margaret H. Campbell.

**WHEREAS**, Jim is survived by his wife of 63 years, Shirley; his daughter, Beth Fine; his son-in-law, David Fine; his son, James Duncan Campbell III; his daughter-in-law, Kristen Campbell; and his grandsons, Kenneth Fine, James Campbell IV and Brooks Campbell;

**WHEREAS**, Jim earned his undergraduate degree from Cornell University and his *juris doctor* from Dickinson Law School;

**WHEREAS**, Jim served his country in uniform, first as a cadet commander of his college ROTC unit, later on active duty in the Judge Advocate General’s Corps and finally as a reserve officer, retiring as a colonel in the United States Army in 1990;

**WHEREAS**, Jim was admitted to practice before a great many courts, including the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania, the U.S. Court of Military Appeals and U.S. Supreme Court;

**WHEREAS**, Jim practiced with a number of Harrisburg law firms, including Nauman, Smith, Shissler, & Hall LLP and Campbell, Spitzer, Davis & Turgeon, concluding his career with Caldwell & Kearns, P.C.;

**WHEREAS**, Jim was an old-school lawyer who believed that ours is an honorable calling whose practitioners must embrace unshakable ethics, contribute to their communities and commit themselves to the welfare of their clients;

**WHEREAS**, Jim served a four-year term on a hearing committee of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court's Disciplinary Board;

**WHEREAS**, Jim served as a long-time member of the Camp Hill Board of Directors from 1983 - 1991 and President from 1989 to 1990;

**WHEREAS**, Jim served as an elder of the Camp Hill Presbyterian Church;

**WHEREAS**, Jim's service to community included the Camp Hill Recreation Commissions, Coach for the Camp Hill Baseball Committee of Little League, Teener League and Americal Legion Teams;

**WHEREAS**, Jim served also as a Director of the Cornell University Phi Kappa Psi Alumni Corporation and Camp Hill Community Foundation;

**WHEREAS**, Jim's time outdoors was a vital part of his life, particularly hunting and fishing, activities he loved to share with his family and friends;

**WHEREAS**, Jim spent his life in service: to his family, his community, his church, his clients and his profession;

**WHEREAS**, Jim was a quiet and generous man who did for others because he believed it was right and not for recognition or accolades;


**WHEREAS**, Jim remains a role model for others, particularly his children, children-in-law and grandsons;
