This fundraiser event is held during Child Abuse Awareness Month so that we can reflect on the impact that child abuse has on the children in our community and recognize the importance of creating better futures for these children.

Did you know that there are on average 400 children in foster care in Dauphin County due to abuse or neglect?

Pennsylvania law allows the court to appoint specially trained volunteers from the local community to work with one child or sibling group, gathering all the information possible about the child's needs and circumstances to report back to the court. The Judge then uses the information provided by the CASA, in addition to information from the caseworkers and guardian ad litem, to make decisions consistent with the best interest of the child. The ultimate goal is to find a permanent "forever" home for the child. Dauphin County CASA is the 20th program to open in Pennsylvania and joins over 1000 such programs across the United States.

We are proud of what we have accomplished in our first year of operation. We have opened our office, hired our Executive Director, Christine Pfau Laney, trained 12 CASAs, who have been assigned several cases that involve 31 children. We are beginning our second pre-service training and will have a new group of volunteers by April to advocate for more children.

The event is chaired by Dr. Susan DiSanto and promises to be an amazing evening of friendship, food and music provided by Soul House. A silent and live auction will be featured. We are so grateful to our Board of Directors and our inaugural class of volunteers who all give of their time to change a child's story from trauma and despair to living in a happy, loving home and moving on to a successful life.
